Sunday Is Sara Posey Day

This Sunday is Sara Posey Day at First Baptist Church. We want to recognize and honor Sara for her twenty years of faithful service here. Sara is retiring as of March 1. She began her work with us March 1, 1960.

Sara grew up in Greenville, with the Pendleton Street Baptist Church her home congregation.

"The Lord has been good to me," says Sara. "My life has been like a story book, with the Lord opening the doors like pages." She recalls the miraculous way the Lord made it possible for her to enter Furman University as a religion major after she had been out of high school for two years and it did not seem possible for her schooling to continue.

She not only finished her B.A. at Furman, but went on to finish the Master of Religious Education degree at Southern Baptist Seminary in Louisville, from what was then known as the Carver School of Missions and Social Work.

Sara led the educational work in three churches in North Carolina: the College Avenue Baptist Church of Lenoir, the Second Baptist Church of Shelby, and the Florence Baptist Church of Forest City.

While serving in these posts she also led Sunday School and Training Union campaigns and held conferences on associational, state, and convention-wide levels.

She was a specialist in Cradle-Roll, Pre-School, and Youth work.

Before coming to Aiken, Sara was education director for the First Baptist Church of Rockville, Maryland, a suburb of Washington, D.C. "Baptist work was small in that area at the time, and I had many opportunities to share with mission work in the area of religious education."

Sara remembers that George Townes was chairman of the personnel committee when she was called to Aiken.

She has worked with three of the pastors of the church and during two interim pastorates. Many have recalled her steadying influence during the time before Dr. Robert Cate was called as pastor.

"I have always loved people and have tried to help wherever I could," Sara says of her work. "I especially liked setting up organizations in new work, as was needed after building programs here and in other churches I served."

"I seemed to run into building programs everywhere."

When asked what her future plans include, Sara mentions just relaxing awhile, then a California trip, to see her niece, Nita and Nita's family.

"I would like to do some shortterm mission projects," she says,
"I just feel like the Lord has something special for me to do."
Her favorite Bible verse is called upon many times, "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths."

Sara will be missed in her full-time ministry at First Baptist, but she plans to remain in Aiken, and will undoubtedly continue to serve the Lord through her church.

"Sara has been a great help to the shut-ins of our church through her visitation and sharing of burdens," says Pastor Chennault in recalling some of Sara's many responsibilities.

Through the years she has
